North Kyme Darby and Joan Club – The end of an era – The end of August saw the sad closure of North Kyme Darby and Joan club due to ever dwindling numbers in recent years. The club was founded in 1957, and ran for 64 years with founder members including Mrs Harrod, Mrs Everard, Mrs Dring and Mrs McGrath. There used to be up to 45 members and records show that in 1995 there were 39 members, including 12 men. Members came from South Kyme and Billinghay and over the years lasting friendships have developed between members, creating a lovely friendly atmosphere at meetings.

A very wide range of speakers have come to the monthly meetings, from woodturners to ice-cream makers, and pyrography demonstrators. One of the highlights of the year was the annual Christmas party when a lovely tea prepared by the members was followed by an evening's entertainment from singers, organ players and brass bands. Probably one of the best loved entertainers were the Billingborough Amateur Theatrical Society, led by the delightful couple Ivan and Barbara Spencer.
