As lockdown eases and we start to return to some sort of normality I'd like to remind you of one of the initiatives the Parish Council are trying to get off the ground but we need your help.

Vice Chairman Andy Yeomans explains further.

I would like to take this opportunity to bring you up-to-date as to where we are with Community Speedwatch. The Parish Council voted to allocate £600 to purchase the equipment for Speedwatch but there was a lack of volunteers to effectively operate it. The bulk of volunteers are from the Parish Council including myself, and whilst there was interest from approximately three of our residents after an appeal on the village Facebook page, this is not enough to operate the initiative effectively. South Kyme have a list of 18 residents they can call on. I have proposed to the Council that this be put on hold unless further volunteers come forward as it would be a waste of the council's funds to have this equipment sat in a cupboard. Please contact any Parish Council member or the Parish Clerk on 01526 860004 if you can spare the time to get this off the ground and keep it operating to reduce the speeding traffic through our village. Beware of scam phone calls warning

In the scam, a message or phone call claiming to be from the NHS test and trace service informs somebody they have come into contact with coronavirus and need to self-isolate and take a test.

The scammers ask them to confirm their address so a testing kit can be sent to them. Bank card details are then requested - purportedly to cover the cost of the testing kit.

In a genuine call, contact tracers will never ask you to make any form of payment or ask for any details about your bank account.
